FOUNDATIONS IN HORTICULTURE

Keywords for Wildlife Module

The purpose of this list is to help you focus on the important keywords from all the educational materials. Please note, these words and definitions do not need to be memorized. Keywords on this list appear in order of appearance in the manual.

Exclusion techniques	Techniques that are designed to keep an animal from getting to the site of damage or problem. (i.e. fencing)
Removal techniques	Removing the animal from the affected area either by capturing and relocating it or killing it.
Repellent techniques	Smell or taste-based substances that prevent animals from gaining entry or doing damage.
Scare tactic techniques	Frightening the offending species away through noise makers, streamers, decoys, etc.
Habitat modification techniques	Eliminating a component of the animal's habitat to make the area less attractive.
Cultural changes techniques	Either changing the way that you garden or the cultivars you select to avoid potential damage.
Randomness in wildlife management	Wildlife management principle in which you use a management technique at random intervals to upset the animal's regular routine.
Diversity in wildlife management	Wildlife management principle in which you use multiple management techniques.
